The Work of Christmas

In his recent Christmas message, Presiding Bishop Michael Curry quoted a wonderful poem written by Howard Thurman:

When the song of the angels is stilled,

When the star in the sky is gone,

When the kings and the princes are home,

When the shepherds are back with their flocks,

Then the work of Christmas begins:

To find the lost.

To heal the broken.

To feed the hungry,

To release the prisoner,

To rebuild the nations,

To bring peace to others,

And alas, to make music in the heart.

What does it mean to be a Christian? Is it about once having had a little water poured on your head? Or saying "Merry Christmas" to the checkout lady at Walmart? Or being able to (mis) quote scripture?

Being a Christian is sometimes difficult and dangerous work. Seeking and serving Christ in all people, loving our neighbors as ourselves, striving for justice and peace among all people, and respecting the dignity of every human being is our baptismal covenant. These practices are the work of our baptism. They are the promises we make when we sign on to being followers of Christ. They require that we embrace and stand up for those on the margins, and that we treat all people as beloved children of God.

Christmas is the story of God's love taking flesh in the person of Jesus. It's a wonderful story filled with angels, kings, shepherds and a humble couple named Mary and Joseph. If you were here at St. Paul's on Christmas eve, you experienced the story in a rambunctious pageant play and in the beauty of darkness, *Silent Night* and candlelight. But now the costumes and candles are put away, and the work of Christmas begins. God's love takes flesh *in us* and moves into the world as we live out our baptismal promises.

Being a Christian is more than a little water on the head and a lot of nice words. It is finding the lost, healing the broken, feeding the hungry, releasing the prisoner, rebuilding the nations, bringing peace to every corner of the earth. Let the work of Christmas begin.

I am delighted that Buffy Helstrom and helpers prepare our 6:00 pm simple suppers. Buffy does a wonderful job preparing a simple, healthy meal that we ask you to help support by making a donation toward defraying the cost.

The 6:30 pm program includes Christian formation for children in preschool grade through confirmation. Character Club is a new program for prek-3rd grade with fun activities based on a different core value each month. 4th-Confirmation age will have formation groups also. There will continue to be a speaker or program for adults. Please let me know if you have suggestions for speakers or programs.

Church Nights will meet three times per month. Two Wednesdays the children/youth will be in their age specific program, one Wednesday we will be together for GIFT; Growing in Faith Together, and we will have one Wednesday where we don't gather at church, instead that time can be used for focusing on faith at home.

January Church Night Programs:

January 10 – As we begin the season of **Epiphany**, we remember that the Holy Family was forced to flee King Herod, becoming refugees in the land of Egypt (Mt. 2: 13-23). So, today, more than 21 million children, women, and men are forced to flee for their lives to escape persecution and violence. We will view the documentary film "**Dying to Get In**" This film provides an intimate perspective of border crossing and the people who cross.

January 17 – We will continue our conversation about **immigrants and refugees** with a presentation developed by Episcopal Migration Ministries. The goal is for you "to come away with a deeper understanding of Episcopal Migration Ministries, refugee resettlement, the stories of our new American neighbors, and how God is calling you into this work." (EMM)

January 24 – Our **G.I.F.T.** (Growing in Faith Together) night will be games and activities to help all ages learn more about the **Bible!** "My Bible" is full of many wonderful resources to encourage you to delve deeper into the Bible. There are games, activities, dramas and intergenerational opportunities to learn about the authors of the books, the key characters and how the Bible speaks into our lives today.
