





SNS (social networking sites) enrich rather than diminish participation in face-to-face relationships

- <u>http://www.pewinternet.org/2011/06/16/social-networking-sites-and-our-lives/</u>
- Some key findings of the report focused on the dominant site, Facebook, where some 92% of social network users have a profile. Among a long list of findings, Pew researchers found that:
- □ Facebook users are more trusting than non-SNS users.
- □ Facebook users have more close relationships than non-SNS users.
- □ Facebook users get more social support than non-SNS users.
- Facebook revives "dormant" relationships that are lost to non-SNS Users


New Faith Formation Operating System




Confirmation Registration is Taking Place Click to Register Now

Confirmation is the sacrament in which you receive a deeper outpouring of the Holy Spirit. It completes what began in Baptism, giving you the gifts and tools needed to live out your whole life as a Catholic. Confirmation preparation is a 2 year process with monthly meetings, online work, service projects, retreats, and Insight participation.

4) ATTEND "INSIGHT" (YOUTH GROUP) MEETINGS


- Attend 2 Insight Youth Ministry Meetings, more is encouraged!
