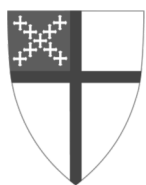

"Called to Love" with Laura Kelly Fanucci

My four-year-old son, Kieran, and I recently traveled to see my father on his 65th birthday. On my father's birthday morning, he sat at the table with Kieran, played cards, and waited for the scrambled eggs I was preparing. He seemed relaxed, despite being in a great time of change: he recently retired, signed up for Medicare, sold his house in the Twin Cities, moved to northern Minnesota, and traveled to Europe with my mother. Meanwhile, my son was telling his grandfather everything he learned in preschool, about how he now has a new orange bike, and his new teachers and friends, and his first trip to the dentist. And I listened and enjoyed their conversation, making food and ready to serve my father, who had so often served me, and my son, who hopefully will make eggs for me when I am 65.



Moments like this remind me that we are all called in different ways at different times. Sometimes we need to serve, relax, tell a story, grieve, love, surrender, let go, try harder, or move on. But so often when we find ourselves in these moments, it can seem that we were led there, that God is calling us to make a difficult choice, or experience a particular feeling. And despite the universality of being called, many callings can make us feel challenged or alone.

St. Paul's will be hosting author Laura Kelly Fanucci on Saturday, October 27th, 2018 to help us discern and reflect upon our callings across our diverse human experiences. We are hosting two separate events: from 9 am – 3 pm, Laura will be presenting and guiding us through our individual callings, and from 6-8 pm we will be hosting a catered dinner, with a focus on calling in marriage and partnerships. This caterer, JB's Cuisine Roulante, is a Duluthian who grew up in Haiti; he creates healthy meals inspired by Caribbean, Mediterranean and French cuisines. Tickets are \$15 per person for one event, or \$25 for both; financial assistance is available. CHURCH NIGHTS IN OCTOBER

Wednesday Church Nights continue in October! Church Nights have become an important part of our Christian Formation program and include something for everyone.

Our 5:30 pm Eucharist is held in church. This is a great way to attend service if you are not able to make it on Sunday (or even if you are able!). We gather in the front pews. We are grateful that Brad Brunfelt will once again lead our music on his guitar. This service is less formal and shorter than Sunday. We use the scripture readings for the coming Sunday.

I am delighted that Buffy Helstrom is preparing our simple suppers again this year. Buffy does a wonderful job preparing a simple, healthy meal that we ask you to help support by making a donation toward defraying the cost. Check out the menu in this edition of the Messenger.

Church Nights will meet three times per month with programming from 6:30-7:30 pm. Two Wednesdays, the children and youth have age-specific faith formation for grades 3 through Confirmation. There is a new "Music and Movement" activity for pre-K through 2nd grade. Faith formation is life-long; so adults have the opportunity to engage in programs, speakers and discussions on various topics. Please let me know if you have suggestions for speakers or programs.

One Wednesday we will be together for GIFT; **Growing In Faith Together**, which gives a chance for all ages to engage in fun faith activities together. We will have one Wednesday where we don't gather at church, instead that time can be used for focusing on faith at home. On the months where there are 5 Wednesdays, our church leaves the building and engages in a service project with a local social service agency or group.

October Church Night Adult Programs will focus on "Calling:"

October 3 – The Challenge of Following Jesus This program focuses on the demands of discipleship and Jesus' instructions for living the Christian life. We will discuss the mission and message of Jesus found in the Gospels and how these apply to our lives today.

October 10 – Acolytes! Our acolytes will reflect on their trip to the National Cathedral in Washington, DC. We will also be reminded of how we are all called to be Instruments of God through a powerful video presentation.

October 17 – Our GIFT (Growing In Faith Together, intergenerational) Night; when all ages come together for a fun, faith-filled hour. Our theme is **Called to Follow Jesus!** Through skits, games and activities; we will learn about some of the followers of Jesus and how we are called to follow Jesus, too!

October 24 – Our Fifth Wednesday Service Project is switched from the 5th to the **Fourth** Wednesday this month due to Halloween, and we'll be doing **Meal Kit Assembly Project for Life House!** Come to the parish hall from 6:30-7:30 pm and assemble nonperishable meal kits that young people who are in need can access when they visit Life House. We made these kits last year and they were greatly appreciated. Our own Amber Sadowski, who works at Life House, will also be giving us an update. This project is funded by our ECMN outreach grant.

October 31 – Church Night is off. Happy Halloween!

NOTES OF A DIFFERENT KIND . . .

Notes of a different kind . . .

I have a new friend. She's a folksinger of some renown in the Duluth area. We met while collaborating on a concert a few weeks ago. After the concert, she gave me a CD she recorded a while back, and I've been listening to it non-stop ever since.

The first song on the CD touches me deeply. It's called *Somewhere to Begin*. She sings about people asking her how she can sing when the world is in such trouble. "How can you sing when so many others grieve?" the song asks. Her reply: "By way of a reply, I say a fool such as I who sees a song as somewhere to begin . . . If changes are to come, there are things that must be done, and a song is somewhere to begin." Those are powerful words. The world is a horrific place. We have people suffering from the aftermath of hurricanes and floods and tornadoes and earthquakes, countries at war, and households where violence is the norm. It would be so easy to give in to despair, but we do not. Each Sunday we start in song, voices gathered into one. We breathe together. We sing praise to God. As we sing, it may seem as though we're oblivious to the world around us, but we are not. It is precisely because of pain and suffering that we do sing.

The second and third verses of the song ask a similar question. "How can you dream when so many others grieve? . . . How can you love when so many others grieve?" The answer is the same: We need to start somewhere. We start with a song. We start with a dream – God's dream. We start with love. What more do we need?

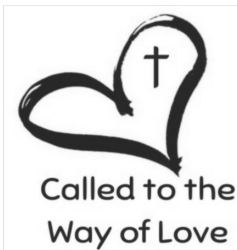

CHRISTIAN FORMATION NEWS

We are off to a wonderful start helping our children, youth and families learn how they are **Called to the Way of Love!** We are committed to instilling values of generosity, love, kindness and gratitude into our children through the fostering of intergenerational relationships and outreach projects that develop a commitment to thinking about and serving others in our parish, our community and beyond and spreading love into a world desperately in need of it.



We are basing all our faith formation on these three core principles: **Love Self:** We are all lovable in the eyes of God. **Love Neighbor:** Children and youth *can* alleviate the suffering of others and make a difference in the world. **Love God:** Children already experience holiness in their lives; we will help them name it as the love of God.

1. **Gratitude comes first!** Thank you to all who helped with Rally Day, the Finding Faith in Harry Potter events, donated to the acolyte trip to Washington DC, and signed on to be faith guides in our formation program!
2. **Prek-2nd Grade Kids Word** will be on October 14, 21 and 28. On October 7, they will remain in church for the special Blessing of the Animals Service.
3. **Blessing of the Animals Service is on October 7:** This shortened service will include blessing for all the creatures in your life! Bring animals on leash or crate, or bring a photo of them and/or a stuffed animal to be blessed.
4. **Faith Formation on Wednesday Church Nights in October are on the 3rd and 10th** for Grades 3rd/4th, 5th/6th, 7th/8th and 9th/10th=Confirmation, and adults. **Music and Movement** for prek-2nd grade will also be on October 3 and 10 and is a fun hour led by our senior high Episcopal Youth Music Campers under the direction of Tom Hamilton, where they use the Orff instruments, percussion and other hand instruments to make fun music and movement. The hour will wind down with some kids yoga moves and meditations to prepare them for bedtime.
5. Our next **GIFT Night; Growing In Faith Together**, when all ages come together for a fun, faithfilled hour will be on Wednesday, October 17 with a very special theme of **Called to Follow Jesus!** Through skits, games and activities; we will learn about some of the followers of Jesus and how we are called to follow Jesus too!
6. October has 5 Wednesdays, so that means its Service Project month! We will be switching the date from the 5th to the 4th Wednesday to avoid Halloween; so **Wednesday, October 24 will be our Meal Kit Assembly Project for Life House!** Come to the parish hall from 6:30-7:30 pm and assemble non-perishable meal kits that young people who are in need can access when they visit Life House. We made these kits last year and they were greatly appreciated.
7. **MN Teens Encounter Christ retreat is coming up October 19-21** at Calvary Episcopal Church in Rochester. TEC is an overnight retreat that empowers teens to integrate the joys, struggles, and epiphanies of their daily lives with the mystery of our shared Christian Faith. Youth who go to TEC say that the TEC community is why they come back. For many it also becomes a foundational reason to go to Church beyond high school. During your 48 hours at TEC you will journey through Holy Week with personal stories, dramas, delicious meals, music, and a few fantastic, encouraging surprises. Everyone is invited to journey at their own pace, with their own questions, making relevant connections to their daily lives. Each weekend is a new experience with new friends as we all share God's rich, unconditional Agape love with one another. Each TEC retreat is run by a team of 40-60 youth who have been through TEC before. Around 20-30 adult volunteers are onsite to assist this inspiring team. The Episcopal Church in Minnesota's (ECMN) Youth Commission meets throughout the year as the decision-making body for all TEC plans. Three of our youth, Hannah Gustafson, Sydney Hanna and Luisa Van Oss represent St. Paul's on the ECMN Youth Commission. To register please go to <http://episcopalmn.org/tec>
8. **National Acolyte Festival in Washington DC**— We are just days away from our trip to the National Cathedral in Washington DC where Angelina, Jack, Hannah, JR, Luisa and Atle will be part of a magnificent procession and service for acolytes from across the country. They will proudly carry the St. Paul's

banner in the procession. Following the service, they will engage in a day of learning through attending various workshops. Joining them will be Eirik Rennan and myself as chaperones. We will also be touring various monuments and museums, and connect with several MN clergy now serving in the DC area. They will be sharing their experience with all of you when they return and making a video on acolyting to share with all of ECMN (Episcopal Church in Minnesota). 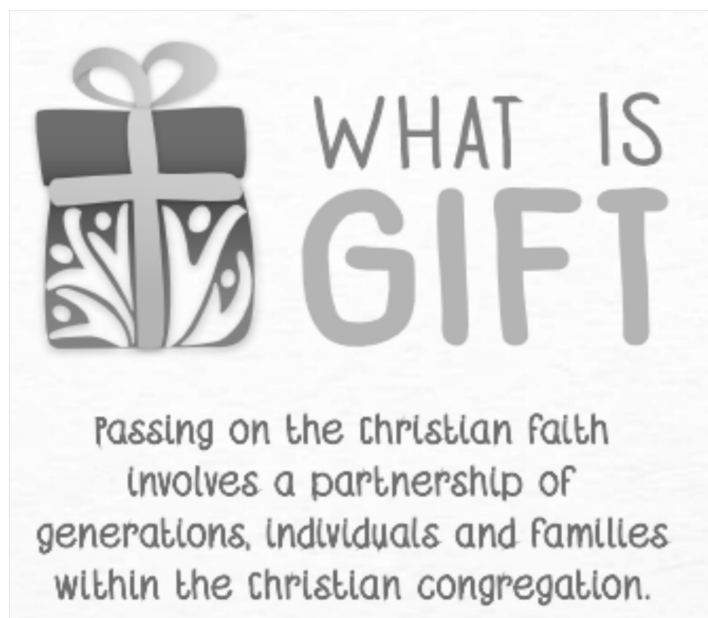

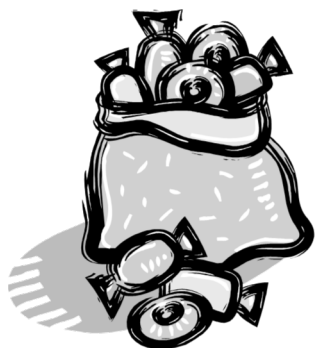
Pumpkin Decorating Sunday, October 28


